Pentre Mawr Park has been visited by a panel of judges to ascertain whether the park now reaches 'Green Flag' status, and the results will be known in July. 'Green Flag' status is an accolade given to park or open space that meets a set of stringent measures either now or in planning for the future of the area.

There are many other projects that are planned and are at an ongoing stage, but other expected projects that are planned with the help of the County and Town councils are:

- Re-establishing the public toilets in the park, based on the existing toilet block which was closed over 25 years ago
- More tables and seating around the cricket viewing area
- A survey of the wildlife in the park including mammals, birds and the pond aquatics
- A rose garden in the Quiet Garden
- Disabled and 'friendly' buggy/wheelchair paths for the Quiet Garden
- Disabled viewing area of the pond nearest the sea with platforms overlooking the lake and the park, with connecting path for the perimeter path. This area will be big enough to provide an assembly area for local school classes to come down and study the pond life
- A duck/wild bird island, a safe haven for nesting birds etc
- Another 4,000 Daffodil, Crocus and Bluebells to be planted around the park
- A new fence around the car park making it easier to walk in and out of the car park
- Ornate entrance gates for the car park

I am sure you can appreciate that some of these projects are large and will take time to come to fruition.
